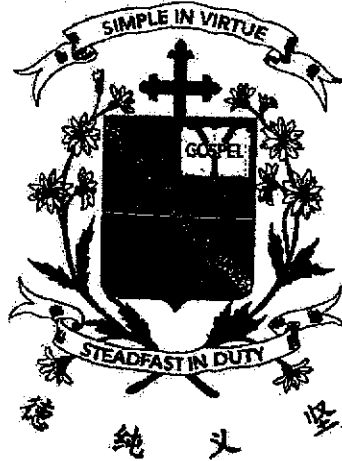

Our goal? Show children that caring for the planet is exciting! By sparking creativity with sustainable activities, we hope to inspire Singapore's next generation of eco-warriors.

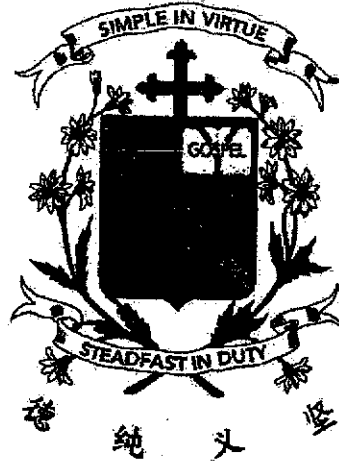

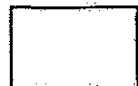
